

Position Description for a Half-Time AmeriCorps Member with Habitat for Humanity of Worcester County 2021-2022

Habitat for Humanity of Worcester County is seeking a Half-Time AmeriCorps member to fulfill the role of Affiliate Support - Family and Volunteer Coordination.

Habitat for Humanity of Worcester County is a local affiliate of Habitat for Humanity International. Our mission is to provide permanent housing solutions to Worcester County residents ensuring all are entitled to a decent, safe place to live. We accomplish this through a combination of new home builds and critical repairs and have recently launched a veteran's repair program. We also operate a 8,250 square foot ReStore which accepts gently used furniture, appliances, building supplies, and housewares and sells them at reduced pricing back to the local community. The proceeds support the mission of the Habitat affiliate.

Member Responsibilities:

- Field calls and emails related to family programs
- Act as the family liaison (once the family application has been approved); check in weekly with the family, schedule home visits (as needed), act as conduit between the family and the contractors for critical repairs and builds; track sweat equity; schedule ground breakings
- Make calls to request or follow up on construction bids
- Schedule equipment for construction sites as directed by management
- Order materials for volunteers such as t-shirts, safety equipment & lunch supplies
- Coordinate and schedule volunteers for construction projects provide basic safety training (program provided); make sure all waivers are signed, take photos for media; track volunteer hours in database
- Provide outreach to present family programs and volunteer opportunities to local groups as opportunities arise
- During periods of down time (no application rounds or active construction projects), assist Executive Director with administrative functions and Development Coordinator with outreach

Requirements for applicants include the following:

- Have a strong interest in serving the community
- Be able to relate to diverse populations
- Be at least 18 years of age

- Able to provide copy of either high school diploma, GED, or college transcript
- Have reliable transportation
- Must successfully pass a comprehensive Criminal History Check, which includes FBI fingerprinting
- Must be a U.S. Citizen, U.S. National, or lawful permanent resident alien
- Applicants DO NOT need to be college students, anyone from the community who fits the above requirements may participate.

Benefits available to the AmeriCorps Member:

- ➤ Valuable experience
- ➤ A bi-weekly stipend of \$300.00
- An education award of \$3,172.50 for future educational expenses or repayment of federal student loans members who are age 55 or older may gift their ed. award to a child or grandchild
- > Federal student loan forbearance while in service, with exemption from paying interest accrued during that time
- ➤ 6 tuition-free credits at Salisbury University for completion of training course
- ➤ Access to AmeriCorps Alumni Network

Hours will mostly be served during our office hours: Wed - Fri 10am - 3pm, however, during active builds/construction projects some Saturdays will be required. Remote work is also possible Mon - Tues to fulfill hours.

The member will begin on or after August 15th, 2021 and must complete 900 hours by August 14th, 2022.

This position is offered through a partnership with ShoreCorps, the AmeriCorps program at Salisbury University. It is contingent upon federal funding and approval of the AmeriCorps office.
